

What is KODIAKOTTON®?

Our KODIAKOTTON® Natural Fiber insulated liners are made up primarily of cotton, with a small amount of polyester, and a nontoxic binder that holds the fibers together.

The KODIAKOTTON® pads are sealed in a recyclable film with a proprietary additive to promote biodegradation.

So how does this effect reuse and disposal options? Read below to find out.

REUSE.

Our liners (with and without the poly film) are **nontoxic**, **hypoallergenic**, and have **no evidence of carcinogenicity**.

They are safe to reuse in many applications – such as a weed barrier, in a compost, and even as a pet bed. Get creative!

RECYCLE.

Being made up of natural fibers, the liners can be recycled with other **#60 textiles**.

The poly film is a low-density polyethylene resin that can be recycled at your local drop off location with other **#4 plastics**.

BIODEGRADABLE.

Natural Fiber Pads are **biodegradable** and **compostable** as tested by an independent third-party laboratory using ASTM test standards.

Because cotton is a plant, it follows a normal cycle of nature. It will naturally go back to the soil from which it was made.



FAQ

Can I use KODIAKOTTON in my home compost?

Yes. Cotton fully biodegrades with and without the poly film.

Is KODIAKOTTON safe for my garden?

Yes. Cotton plants contain many nutrients that can be very beneficial to any type garden.

Can I use KODIAKOTTON to insulate my house?

Because our liners are all natural, they have not been treated with fire retardants and are not recommended to insulate a home.

What happens to the liners in a landfill?

Cotton biodegrades both aerobically and anaerobically. This means the product can fully biodegrade both in a composting environment and in a landfill. If you choose to throw away the liners, we recommend recycling the poly film first to quicken the biodegradation process.
